About the Client

Kilmartin N6 (24hr) Service Station, Dublin Road Athlone, was first set up in 1999 and now boasts a convenience store with a hot food deli counter as well as all other services including fuel, air, and water.

Since this service station operates 24hrs a day, 365 days a year, running open refrigeration systems and an extensive food/ deli counter, the electrical consumption is very high. In a bid to reduce energy consumption, an upgrade of all refrigeration units is to be carried out.

The team at 3 Counties Energy Agency coordinated the entire Better Energy Community (BEC) application from the initial energy audit, procurement to warranty checks and all required paperwork.



The Challenge

In 2017 the site used 395,819 kW/h at a cost of about €63,331. The challenge is to reduce consumption in a financially viable manner. This will be done by upgrading the refrigeration units to ones with a higher energy efficiency.

The Approach

In order to reduce annual energy consumption, it has been decided following an energy audit, to upgrade the refrigeration units to ones with a higher energy efficiency. This will save money and reduce the carbon footprint of the building.

Results



18.797 tonnes CO2

Energy savings

Reduced carbon footprint by 18.8 tonnes by investing in a refrigeration upgrade system. The refrigeration upgrade has led to a reduction in energy bills on the site.

Investment payback time is just over 6 and a half years.
